# **Talk for Writing**

Talk for writing is a different way of teaching writing. It starts with the children learning a model text – they do actually learn it word for word and they use pictures and actions to help them remember it. They then investigate the features of the text before writing their own versions in a similar style. The whole process takes about 2 to 3 weeks. Before they start each style of writing (newspaper, story, etc.) they write a Cold Task and at the end they write a Hot Task – these should show progress and demonstrate how much the children have developed their writing skills during that time. Sometimes we'll start with a whole school theme – this is called the Hook for Learning. The final piece of writing will be written up and displayed in the classrooms on the Best Writing Walls.

To Share our learning we'd like to invite you all to come and have Afternoon Tea with us on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> January 2018. You'll be able to see your child's work and have some tea, sandwiches and cakes with your children. We'll send out more details nearer the time.

Our prices are as follows:

#### **Breakfast Club:**

From 7:45 to 8:45 = £2.75 From 8am to 8:45 = £2.25

#### **After School Club:**

Up to 4pm = £2.75 Up to 4:30pm = £3.75 Up to 5pm = £4.75 Up to 5:30pm = £6.25

Both clubs are very well organised.

They offer a range of activities including: games, construction, colouring, drawing and toys. Outdoor play is sometimes available – weather permitting. All staff have DBS checks and are also part of the school team.

## Breakfast and After School
