We will focus on writing recounts, firstly of the 'tea party' that took place in the playground and moving on to recounting a walk along the canal.






The children will also write wanted posters, instructions for baking and a newspaper article.

We will also write stories inspired by 'The Mad Hatter's Tea Party.'


Numeracy

Science





We will be looking at living things and their habitats. The children will have opportunity to explore and identify a variety of common wild and garden plants and animals in their local environment.





We will look at the structure of a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. We will look at animals in different habitats and explore how the basic needs of different plants and animals are met within each habitat.

We will also look at what humans need to keep healthy and the importance of exercise, eating the right amounts of different types of food, and hygiene.

History/Geography

We will look at the four countries that make up the United Kingdom and their capital cities.



We will locate Furness Vale on a map and use geographical vocabulary to describe it.

We will look at the human and physical features of our area and devise a simple map and key.



We will take a walk along the canal and look at the features of that area.

We will also look at Furness Vale through the ages and draw comparisons between the past and the present.
