This term's topic is crime & punishment we will be incorporating history, geography, art and D.T. into our topic lessons.


Topic will also be incorporated into literacy lessons and where possible maths lessons.

Throughout the term we will be looking into how crime & punishment has changed through the ages, how it is now and we will even be visiting the Manchester Police Museum to further our knowledge.




Literacy

This term we will focus on diary entries, mythical stories, poetry and report writing.




Maths




In maths this term we will be learning about shapes and how they are measured, measuring angles, area and perimeter, whilst also looking at symmetry.
