Literacy

We will continue to use the talk for writing approach and strategies to develop our writing skills.



We will be practising the writing process (plan, draft, write, evaluate and edit).



Our writing will cover a variety of genres including plays, explanations and lots of creative writing.


We will study stories from Africa to learn about its culture.

There will also be a short daily grammar and punctuation lesson which will introduce content such as conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions. In addition, we will revisit the subjects taught in previous terms.


We will continue with Guided Reading in groups with a teacher and also a TA each week and daily spelling practice.

They can use Times Tables Rock Stars, www.timestables.me.uk or www.timestables.co.uk.



The children will learn how to code and about internet safety.






RE

SCIENCE

In Science lessons, the children will focus on developing their knowledge of the digestive system in humans,

different types of teeth and their functions and food chains.

PE

Dance will take place with a specialist teacher every Thursday afternoon this term.

The children will be given the wonderful opportunity to visit White Hall Outdoor Centre for a full programme of exciting experiences. They will attend on six full days on Fridays this term (dates have been given out already).



History/Geography Topic

The children will learn to locate countries in the diverse continent of Africa using maps and find out about its contrasting climates, deserts and drought.

We are planning to take the children to visit Chester Zoo

later in the term to experience African animals at close hand.







Music

Following on from Djembe drumming in the Autumn term, the children will be learning to play the Samba drums for a further 15 weeks!

They will continue to develop their sense of pulse, explore rhythm and read musical notation.

Art/ Design and Technology

We will explore African patterns and African artists.



We will also design and make African instruments, tribal masks and develop our painting skills.

Brain Builder homework will be given out each week on Friday and must be handed in by the following Friday.

Reading should take place daily and needs to be recorded in the Reading Record book. Please try to write a comment in the Reading Record book when you hear your child read and discuss the content of what they have read with them.

Each week your child will have spellings to learn both at home and in school.
