One of my favourite passions is outdoor sports. I think children learn so much about themselves when they step out of the classroom and take on completely different challenges. So far, Class A has been working with White Hall on their STEM project for 3 days and Class B have had 3 days at White Hall. Next term, Class B will have another 3 days and in the Summer Term Class A will go to Lea Green for a 3-day residential. The activities that the children do push their personal boundaries. During the Class B days at White Hall, it was interesting to see how much more confident the year 4 children were because they went to White Hall for 6 days this time last year. Most of the outdoor activities that we do are funded by the Sports Premium money but the PTFA kindly gave £750 towards the Y5/6 Stem project. Our trip to Paris is in July – this is the first time we've looked at doing trips abroad and, hopefully, there will be many more to follow.

We have changed the system we use for sending reading books home in Reception and KS1. The main change is that children will only take books home that they can comfortably decode (break the words into sounds and read). The more they read these books, the more fluent they become – I can't begin to stress how vital this is! Children must practice their reading books at least once a day – don't let them fob you off by saying they've already read it. Read it with them, using a storyteller's voice, until they can read it just as fluently as you can, and with expression, too! They can also read the book bag book that comes with it. Lastly, they can share a favourite Story Time book that you can read with/to them, repeatedly. Pick books that you are passionate about and love reading. We want children to have a storyteller's voice and love reading books, even before they can actual words.

On March 27th, we're having a whole school visit to Chester Zoo!! This will fit in with the children's learning and be a great opportunity to spend quality time together at an excellent venue.
