Reception Home Learning - Friday 3rd April 2020

The children will be sent four tasks to complete each day. They MUST complete these task plus reading their RWI books. An exercise book has been sent home for sentence writing and a blank book for any pictures they are asked to create.

Mathematics

We are going to learn about positional language. Positional language means using words such behind, on top, in front, next to.

Ask an adult to hide a toy in your house. Ask questions to find out where it is, starting with the room it is in and then more specific questions, e.g. "Is it underneath something?" or "Is it behind something?" Then, you could hide the toy and they can ask the questions to find it.

Physical Development

Find something soft and light to balance on your head like an Easter bonnet.

Can you walk along and keep it balanced?
What other ways can you move and still keep the bonnet on your head?
Can you turn around?

Can you sit down?

Expressive Arts and Design

Can you make an Easter craft?

You could make a handprint chick or a paper plate bunny. You could make a model using cardboard boxes.

Use your imagination and see what you can make.

Literacy

You have read 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', if you want you can listen to it again.

Your task today is to imagine you are a very hungry caterpillar, write the days of the week and write down what you would like to eat on each day. Remember you are really hungry and your list will get longer each day.
