

Year Five- Week beginning 23.20.20

For this week in maths the children could revise their understanding of place value in decimals. I have put a link to the website Whiterose that teachers at Furness Vale use a lot, in their planning. There is an exploratory lesson and activity for each day. We have covered this but I am aware that some children were missing and it will be a useful refresher of the topic. If children want to do further maths they can always complete some of the tasks from their maths book that was sent home or go on 123 maths, Times Table Rock Stars or K&maths.

For literacy I have included a link to the Hamilton Trust website for this week as they have also provided a free home learning pack which covers grammar and writing relevant to this year. I would also like children to do one writing activity a week from the Twinkl pack I gave them. This week it is to advertise their town. Please can they persuade the reader to take their next holiday to the town where they live? Think about the features of persuasive writing and how you will make this stand out. It would be very helpful if children also spent time trying to learn the spellings for year 5 and 6 plus year 3 and 4. I will attach a list so that they could look through them. It may be a good idea to choose five to learn a week. At school we practise the look, say, cover, write and check approach so they could do this at the beginning of any English work. They could also practise writing them neatly to keep up with their handwriting skills.

In guided reading one group were reading the book Charlotte's Web by EB White and another were reading the book Varjak Paw. I have managed to find a copy of Charlotte's Web online for free so will set some reading comprehension questions from that soon. The other group read the first four chapters of this so if the children could spend the time catching up with this this week.

Watch a short video of the water cycle. Watch the animation and identify when evaporation, transpiration, condensation and precipitation occur. **Evaporation** is when the sun heats up the Earth's water, it changes into gas (water vapour). Gas is lighter than water and so it rises up into the sky. As the water vapour cools, **condensation** happens. It condenses and turns back into water. There is always water vapour in the air, even on clear days. Fog is condensing water near to the ground. Water is heavier than gas and it falls back to Earth as **precipitation**. We have many names for this: rain, drizzle, sleet, hail, snow... The cycle happens over and over again. No water on the Earth is ever created from scratch or lost anywhere. The Earth has always had the same amount of water – it is just stored in different places at different times. Plants store water they collect from the ground. When it evaporates out of the plants through their foliage, it is called **transpiration**. Have a go at making your own water cycle experiment from youtube video here:
