

Class B's Easter Home Learning



Please find below a selection of tasks/ideas to keep you busy this Easter.

1. Imagine that one day you find an unusual egg in your garden. Where has it come from? How will you care for it? What might happen if it hatches? Write a story about the discovery of the egg and your adventure afterwards.
2. Write an acrostic poem. The first letter of each line should spell EASTER.
3. Draw a comic strip about the key events of the Easter Story. Write underneath the pictures.
4. Draw a net (a flat version) of a cube to make an Easter box/basket and decorate it. Maybe the Easter Bunny will put some mini chocolate eggs inside!
5. Complete the Spring Code Breaker Maths and play the Easter Holiday Board Game with someone in your family. There are two levels of difficulty.
6. Research how to make a pompom chick and then have a go.
7. National Pet Month is from 1st April - 1st May. Prepare a presentation about your pet(s) or a family member's pet. You could use PowerPoint if you have it. Don't forget to include lots of details such as how you look after them, their likes and dislikes, what makes them special, photographs or artwork.
8. April 15th is the anniversary of the sinking of the Titanic. Can you research all about the Titanic and what happened to it. Present your findings in an interesting way.
9. Keep up daily reading. Other skills to practise with your family could be: make sure you can tie laces, you can read the time using a clock with moving hands not just digital and help out with Easter cooking.
