Geography- Continue to work on rivers around the world. Today the children should research some facts about the major rivers in the world: The Rhine, The Volga, The Ganges, The Yangtze, The Nile, The Congo, The Panama, The Amazon, The Mississippi, The Rio Grande. Can children find out the Continent they are in, the length, the country where the source is, the place where the mouth/estuary/delta is, the ocean or sea that the river flows into and any other information that they can find. If you are able to you could print off a world map that children could try to draw the rivers on to.

Can children write the next part of their Easter diary imagining they are one of the disciples (Good Friday to Easter Sunday) Alternatively children could have a go at making the Easter story out of plasticine, photographing this and making it into a powerpoint then accompanying it with text.

Wednesday

Spag- Schofield and Sims grammar book.

Science- Ask the children why they think we get shadows? Do you have a shadow at home? If the sun was behind you and you were outside where would your shadow be? If it is a sunny day go into the garden and with chalk draw round your shadow on the ground. Measure the length of it and round it to the nearest cm. Then write down what time you measure it. Repeat this at 10, 11, 12 and 2. (Can do more if you want) Ask children to observe what happens to their shadows and write the different lengths down. Ask the children to consider three explanations for the changing shape and position of the shadows: 1. The sun moves from one side of the sky to the other. 2. The Sun goes around the Earth 3. The Earth turns around so the Sun seems to move.

Discuss this together then watch the video clips about how we get day and night and what this shows us about shadows.

Is it night for the whole planet at the same time or different times? When it is noon in one part of the world, where will it be midnight? In what direction does the Sun appear to rise? Why? In what direction does the Sun appear to set? Why? How long does it take the earth to rotate once?
