Alternative Setting goals is an excellent way for your child to try and achieve things that they might not think is possible. Goal setting will also help your child to improve their confidence and self-esteem when they see that they can achieve the target they've set. Create a 'Wheel of Fortune' together (see below). Use the headings: Learning, Friendships, Physical Challenge, Wellbeing and Family. Under each heading, ask your child to write a goal thinking carefully about how long it will take to achieve each goal, who or what can help them and any difficulties they may have to overcome.

Planning a Celebration- It's time to plan a celebration event of their choice. This could be an end of term party, a birthday party or other celebration or anything else they wish to plan. Tell them they have £150 to spend and 25 guests will be attending. What will the money be spent on? Ask them to plan the celebration considering the location of the event, how they will decorate the venue, what their guests will eat and drink and how they will entertain their guests. Get them to detail the timings of the event and any timings for preparation. Alternatively Planning, preparing and making meals is a skill for life. With a budget of £4.50 per person you have to plan (and make) all the food for a party.
