We will be continuing with our daily Read Write Inc. phonics, reading and writing lessons.







We will count in 2s, 5s and 10s and work on one more and one less.


















Money, money, money!

Locate London on a map and other UK cities.


Find out about the important roll the river Thames played and the devastating impact on St Paul's Cathedral.
