



## Activity Day Information for Parents and Children

We have put the following procedures in place to help ensure that your child has a fantastic day at White Hall. We have risk assessed the activity days in relation to minimising the risk of transmission of Coronavirus (Covid -19) and have put in place procedures to implement protective measures.

Please read the following information and share with your child who is attending the activity day.

Please do not let your child attend if they or anyone in your household has Coronavirus (Covid-19) symptoms.

If a child shows symptoms whilst at White Hall, parents will be contacted and asked to collect their child immediately. Please ensure the emergency contact details you put on the consent form are up to date.

### During the activity day:

- Children will be directed to wash their hands/sanitise regularly throughout the day. They will be sensitively encouraged to keep good distance, as best they can, from others.
- Please reinforce the importance of regular hand washing/sanitising. Our instructors will carry hand sanitiser and we ask that every child has a small bottle of this with them as well if you know they might react to hand sanitisers.
- We will ensure good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
- We will minimise contact between individuals and maintain social distancing wherever possible.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- We will, where necessary, wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE).

We will continue enhanced cleaning at the centre, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces such as door handles, light switches, tables, wash basins, toilets and showers often.

We have reduced the capacity that we can take for the activity days. The members of each group will be from the same school bubble. There will be at least one White Hall instructor and member of school staff with each group.



## What happens when our school arrive at White Hall in the morning?

Our activity days start from 9:00. Arrival procedures will depend on the mode of transport. Information will be given to schools when we know this. We will meet your group and take each group to their own base for the day. They will be able to leave personal possessions there and eat lunch if the weather doesn't allow this outside. Before we enter any buildings, we will ask everyone to wash their hands or use hand sanitiser.

## Snacks, drinks and packed lunch

Please can you ask your child not to share any food or drinks during their days here. Where possible we will eat lunch outside. If that is not possible, each group will use their bases.

## Activities

We have risk assessed all the activities in line with covid-19 guidelines and are following the guidance of the national governing bodies. This means that there are some activities that we may be unable to do.

The activities we do, either, allow us to be socially distanced or we have adapted them for this. For safety reasons there may be occasions where we will need to be closer than 2 metres, but we have planned the activities to avoid this wherever possible. If we need to administer first aid, we will need to be closer than 2 metres. If we are closer than 2 metres our staff will wear face coverings.

If your child is attending a multi-day course you may be doing activities that require shower facilities. Please explain to your child the importance of putting all their wet clothes straight into a plastic bag and not leaving anything in the changing rooms.

## Minibus travel

If your child is attending a multi-day course, to enable us to go to different venues for activities, we will be using our minibuses. Children will only ever be in a bus with children from their own bubble. There will be a White Hall instructor who will have a face covering. We will ask visiting staff and everyone over 11 to wear a face covering or buff, or we will follow the school protocol.

Minibuses will be disinfected before and after use; this includes door handles, driving equipment, seats and seat belts.



## What happens at the end of the day?

At the end of the day we will ask each group to ensure they have got all their possessions, spare clothes and footwear with them. We will ask them to wash their hands before leaving the centre. Pick up procedure will depend on the mode of transport.

## Personal kit

The school will give you a list of things needed for the day. Please ask your child to keep all their kit that they bring with them each day together, so we don't have clothes etc. left around. Please can items be labelled with their name. Subject to the protocol of the school you may be asked to send a face covering or buff with your child.

If your child will be doing activities that require wellies, and has some, please include them in the kit your child brings.

Please do not let children bring mobile phones to White Hall. There will be nowhere safe to keep them whilst doing activities.

Please can you encourage your child to be able to tie their own laces to help us maintain social distancing between adults and children.

## Equipment

We ask that where possible children bring their own waterproof coats, and trousers if already owned. We can issue these to children if necessary.

Every time equipment such as helmets and harnesses are finished with, they will be cleaned or put into quarantine for 72 hours.
