#### World Book Day

We are giving the children the opportunity to either dress as a book character or come to school in full uniform, just to be clear, this is not a non-uniform day. The poetry competition will be judged on World Book Day and on the day we plan for all children to make books and take part in buddy reading in school.

# Is your child entitled to Free School Meals/Pupil Premium?

Pupil premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers.

It was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years.

Your child or children can get a Free School Meal if you, your partner or the child are in receipt of certain benefits. Please check the link below to see if you qualify.
