Read Write Inc. (Phonics)



We have been following the Read Write Inc. programme for 5 years and it has proven to be a successful and exciting way of learning to read and write. The program is fantastic!

It helps the Reception children learn the correct letter formation, letter sounds, blending and segmenting and also provides them with a love for reading. The children in Reception will have regular morning sessions which will increase in time as the year goes on.

Our Nursery children are also introduced to the programme, these are short and the focus is mainly on letter sounds.

As the children start the Read Write Inc. programme, they will most probably come home telling you all the new sounds they are learning. Please encourage this and for any further support, please speak to me on the gate or through Class Dojo.

We will have an open morning/afternoon to tell you all about it in due course. It is so important during the early years of development that your child is read to on a regular basis even if it's the same storybook over and over again ©

The children will be sent home with a story book of their choice in the first term until they are able to read simple sentences independently. These books will be changed on a Friday.



Class Dojo

Class Dojo is our way of communicating with you and letting you know what the children have been up to and it's also a way for you to communicate with me in case you have any questions or concerns.

It is private, so please do not worry about other people reading it. We will be also using Dojo as a reward system so you can see what your child is being rewarded for.

I hopefully have set you all up this week, but please let me know if you have any problems.

Rewards

We give stickers and Dojo's out throughout the day. The Dojo's are a whole school reward, the children will be given dojos through our Classroom and there will be a reward for who has the most at the end of the week.

On a Friday afternoon, we have a well-done assembly, where one child is chosen from Class D to accept a certificate in front of the school for their achievements that week.

Forest School

During the year, we will be taking the children outside as much as possible to take part in forest schools. Please could you send in a pair of wellies for your child to wear and leave them at school if possible.

P.E

PE this term will be on a Wednesday afternoon.

If you haven't already done so, could you please send in their kits, which is a plain white t-shirt, black shorts/leggings/jogging bottoms and a pair of pumps or trainers.

This will be kept in school until the end of each term.





We know the children like to bring toys/objects from home in to school to show their friends, but please could you persuade them not to.

If they lose their toy/object in school, it is very hard to find it again and I do not want your child to be upset. There are lots of toys in our department for them to play with ©.

Homework

The children will be given a homework book which will be where they can do the homework set for them through Class Dojo.

This will enable you to see their homework online and you can also upload their work on there too, which will be shared in class. The homework will be available on a Friday and should be handed in by Thursday.

The children should enjoy the tasks set; they only have to choose one of the three tasks however, it is optional as they are only young.

We will celebrate some of the work they have done on a Friday afternoon or in assembly.
